

Commuting Statistics


The map at the left represents commuting patterns into Monticello with the concentration per ZIP code represented in the legend.



ARTS & CULTURE

As the birthplace of Grant Wood, most famous for his painting American Gothic, Jones County is rich with culture and history. You can visit Stone City, where Wood hosted his famous art colony, the Antioch School, the one room school house he went to, his gravesite and a gallery devoted to displaying his work. Each year Stone City celebrates art during their Stone City Festival held in September.

Local and regional artists and actors can find a home in Jones County as well. Anamosa and Monticello each boast robust art galleries that feature paintings, sculpture and other display art. Starlighters II Theatre, located on Main Street in Anamosa, showcases the talented community that live in the region.

For wine connoisseurs, you can find two wineries here. The Daly Creek Winery and Bistro in Anamosa and Crimson Sunset Vineyards located just off US 151 between Monticello and Cascade.

The facility is located at the crossroads of US Highway 151 and Highway 64 and employs approximately 175 people.


Close proximity to metro areas allow a person to live in a smaller town with a neighborly atmosphere, with easy access to bigger city amenities.

STATE

"The State of Iowa offers a variety of options in financial assistance to assist with relocations and expansions. Assistance is provided in the form of Ioans, forgivable Ioans and/or tax incentives based in part on job creation, capital investment, the ability to meet certain wage standards, quality of employment, and economic benefits for the state and local community." State of Iowa programs/assistance include:

- EB-5 Regional Center provides assistance to those interested in funding through the program.
- Employee Stock Ownership Formation Assistance & Tax Deductions upon sale of stock
- High Quality Jobs Program provides financial incentives for locating, expanding or modernizing an lowa facility based on wage threshold requirements. The wage threshold varies based on where you locate in Jones County. The actual award amounts will be based on the business's level of need, the quality of the jobs, the percentage of created or retained jobs defined as high-quality, and the economic impact of the project.

LOCAL


Each of the communities in Jones County operate under their own set of policies and procedures in regards to providing incentives for development. Monetary incentives have included tax rebates, grants and/or fee waivers. These types of incentives can be offered based on several different variables including, but not limited to, building valuation, high quality jobs, and/or a need for the specific type of business offered.

In addition, Jones County employers have access to the Maquoketa Valley Electric Cooperative Revolving Loan Fund, as well as the East Central Iowa Council of Governments Revolving Loan Fund. Both funds are competitive, low interest, gap financing opportunities.

Jones County Economic Development will be your advocate in the process of working with the state and our communities to help you locate your business here.

COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Training dollars are available through Kirkwood Community College and the State of Iowa Code 260E-the Iowa New Jobs Training Program. Kirkwood finances your training and you repay the certificates by diverting a portion of state withholding taxes on the new employees' wages from the state and/or by providing local property tax receipts from new capital investments. Since both of these funding sources involve money that your business would pay in any event, they are not additional taxes, thus the training is subsidized.
